Pastor's Postings Catch the Easter Excitement!

We all know people who constantly expect the worst. Life is very stressful for them because they are always worrying. When this kind of person is also a Christian, there is a contradiction. Billy Graham was once asked if he was an optimist or a pessimist. He replied, "I don't have a choice, I'm a Christian." The Apostle Paul wrote, "No matter how many promises God has made, they are 'Yes' in Christ" (2 Corinthians 1:20 NIV). A Christian should be characterized by an upbeat expectation of what God is going to do.

Easter is the perfect time for Christians to enlarge their faith outlook. During Jesus' ministry, his disciples had concrete positive expectations about Him. They anticipated that He would soon be crowned king and they would get important positions in the new government. But when Jesus died, those expectations were destroyed. In the midst of their sorrow, Jesus rose from the dead and began to appear to them and point them toward a new and exciting ministry. Their spiritual anticipation began to bloom again. Later, Pentecost again exploded their small expectations. As God did miracles through them, they began to understand more of what Jesus meant when He said, "With God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26).

God is always at work on a Christian's behalf. As God said through His prophet, "I know the plans I have for you,' declares the LORD, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future'" (Jeremiah 29:11). Jesus taught, "My Father is always at His work to this very day, and I, too, am working" (John 5:17). So we have every reason to look forward to what God is going to do in our lives. Norman Vincent Peale called it "positive thinking." The writer of Hebrews 11 simply calls it faith!

This Easter season our theme is "Catch the Easter Excitement." At Easter, God blew away the old limits and introduced exciting new possibilities. One of our goals will be to increase our faith in what God can and will do in our lives as we trust Him. God "is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us!" (Ephesians 3:20-21). Now that's exciting!

Pilgrim's Progress — April 18 & 20

We highly recommend this new CGI animated film of John Bunyan's classic masterpiece! Second only to the Bible as one of the most popular books of all time, it is the story of Christian's challenging journey to the Celestial City. He learns the importance of God's Word and trusting in Christ as he deals with doubts and distractions.



As an allegory, the story will appeal to children on a surface level, with lessons on faith for those who look deeper, thus inspiring adults as well.

Bunyan wrote the book while imprisoned for his faith. Executive Producer Steve Cleary reports that The Pilgrim's Progress has inspired persecuted Christians in many countries. Part of the film's profits will help support international missions.

The movie is showing in theaters in Enfield, West Springfield, and Buckland Hills on Thursday, April 18 at 7 PM and Saturday, April 20 at 12:55 PM.

Special Church Aid

The Connecticut District has put out a call for aid for the Winsted United

the Winsted church raised funds which allowed them to replace the roof, reinforce the steeple, re-

paint the exterior, and begin painting the sanctuary. Unfortunately, their funds have run dry, and they have discovered serious issues with water leaking in the Narthex. It is a large building for a small con-



gregation (similar in size to Copper Hill), and it is difficult to maintain.

In the past, Copper Hill has received assistance from area churches when we have had construction projects. So it only seems right to aid fellow churches in a time of need.

At the March meeting, our Church Council voted to donate \$5,000 to help the Winsted church. It is likely that the UMW will also make a donation for this cause, though we will have to wait for the April meeting to make this decision. We are opening up the opportunity to individuals as well.
