When children discover something curious or unusual and want their parents to see it, they often come running to Mom and Dad, tug on their clothes and exclaim urgently, "Come and see!"

That is exactly the phrase the apostle Philip used after he had met Jesus and began telling his friend, Nathanael, about him. The Bible says that Nathanael was cynical and said, "Nazareth! Can anything good come from there?' "Come and see," replied Philip" (John 1:44-46 NIV).

Many today like Nathanael are cynical. Influenced by negative media portrayals, they may even distrust religious people. When someone talks about having faith or coming to church, they might say, "What help could that be?"

The Christmas Spirit, however, has a way of contradicting our easy dismissals of Jesus. As we participate in holiday celebrations, we begin to open our minds and hearts to a baby boy born 2000 years ago. And we may find ourselves asking questions like, "What did it all mean?" Perhaps it is God's Spirit Himself inviting us to the manger and whispering in our hearts, "Come and See!"

- 4. Electricity Fund for our electric bills




Giving to Our Community


