## **Helping Others**

This fall Copper Hill Church has continued its mission to serve others by contributing to several critical needs:

#### **Hurricane Dorian Relief**

In keeping with the tradition started last year by our generous response to hurricane relief for Puerto Rico, this October, we sent a total of \$1,475 to UMCOR for Hurricane Dorian relief. This total consisted of a special offering and a contribution from our quarterly missions giving. We believe it is critical to help those who are suffering in their time of need.

#### **World Hope Contribution**

Late in the summer, the congregation surprised Pastor Kelvin and JoAnne by sending \$350 to their favorite charity, World Hope International, in honor of Pastor Kelvin and JoAnne's forty years of ministry. World Hope has been active in Hurricane Dorian relief, working with partners to supply drinking water in the most devasted areas of Abaco Island. World Hope has been a leader in anti-human trafficking efforts, especially in Cambodia.

#### Helping Local Food Pantries



We continue to help those in our local area who are food insecure. Contributions to the Local Food pantries con-

tinue in several ways. In addition to contributions through our church, we also give all proceeds from used clothing donations in the St. Pauly's shed to local food pantries. From week to week, our parishioners bring in non-perishable food and other items to be taken to the food pantry for distribution.

One of our traditions and another way we help is to cooperate with other agencies in our area in providing baskets of food to those who could use a hand with Thanksgiving festivities.
